


School-age Programs: Kindergarten and Up

Curriculum

Schedules

Families of infants, toddlers and twos may choose from the following schedules:

- * Full-day (6:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m.)
- * Core-day (9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.)



*Infants & Toddlers must be enrolled full-time (Monday-Friday)
Twos must choose a M/W/F or T/Th schedule for part-time care.*

Infant/Toddler/Twos Program Highlights

Our Infant-Toddler program focuses on meeting the youngest children's individual needs through responsive care and positive interactions.

Infants/Toddlers have individual schedules in regard to eating, sleeping, and active play needs.

Our program for two-year-old children works to bridge the gap between the dependency of the infant and the independence of the preschooler. Knowledgeable staff are readily available to create a scaffolding of early learning experiences, constantly creating a balance between security and challenge.

Daily written communication provides parents with insight into each child's individual activities. In addition, materials are carefully chosen and readily available to encourage manipulation and exploration of the young child's world.

Healthy Beginnings (Birth—Age 3) developed by the State of Maryland is used as a developmental guide for assessing growth and development in addition to the *Creative Curriculum Text for Infants, Toddlers and Twos*.

Schedules

Full-day Preschool Program: Educare's full day option includes an imbedded preschool curriculum within a wrap-around childcare program. Families can choose from the following options:

- * Full-day (6:30 a.m.-6:30 p.m.)
- * Core-day (9:00 a.m.-3:00 p.m.)

Families must choose a M/W/F or T/Th schedule for part-time care.

Preschool-Hours Only Program: For families wanting a preschool-hours-only program, Educare provides a multi-age program for three and four year olds. This program follows the Frederick County Public School System calendar. Children must be 3 years old by Sept. 1 to enroll. Families can choose from the following schedules offered 9:00 a.m.-1:00 p.m. (families provide lunch):

- * 5-Day Option: Monday-Friday
- * 3-Day Option: Monday, Wednesday, Friday
- * 2-Day Option: Tuesday, Thursday



Program Highlights

Our preschool programs promote school readiness as the primary goal for children's development and learning. We facilitate cognitive growth through a balance of child-initiated play and teacher-directed experiences. The social-emotional development of preschool-aged children is supported by building confidence, trust, and independence through a multitude of daily experiences with others. Physical development is enhanced through indoor and outdoor play opportunities that allow children to perfect their fine and large motor skills.

State Approved Curriculum

Educare Learning Center uses the *Creative Curriculum* published by Teaching Strategies. This curriculum focuses on establishing a well-organized environment as a framework that supports higher levels of learning.

Domains of Learning

Our preschool-age programming is guided by the MSDE Ready for Kindergarten (R4K) Model. The Work Sampling System provides a framework to assess growth and development using the following domains of learning: language and literacy, personal and social, mathematical thinking, scientific thinking, social studies, the arts, and physical development and health. Parent-teacher conferences are held in the Fall and Spring.

Specials

Special classes are offered as curriculum enhancements including: music, nutrition (Food Groupies), social skills (Second Step), STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math), Cooking Fun, Fitness Focus, and off-site/on-site field trips.

Nature-al Discoveries Curriculum

The Educare Learning Center has a comprehensive nature program called "Nature-al Discoveries" that includes gardening, ecological awareness, environmental awareness, natural science exploration and community service. Children take monthly discovery walks down our discovery path which leads to Catocin and Broad Run Creeks.
